Be careful when drafting co-tenancy, parking, and common area maintenance provisions in leases within a mixed-use development.




















How to address use restrictions and the rights of existing tenants in mixeduse developments.







How to manage the complete redevelopment of an existing mall, including the termination of existing tenants and the timing of demolition and redevelopment.










Dealing with partial redevelopment issues, such as construction issues arising from the demolition of vacant boxes only and the protection of rights of existing tenants.

How to manage tenant vacancies at a shopping center. Replacing retail vacancies with office and residential tenants.






