Nearly 70% of shopping center tenants are small businesses that employ less than 10 people. Data associated with the retail real estate industry includes both shopping centers and freestanding retail establishments. In cases where this data was not available, we refer to shopping centers only. Statistics are from 2019 and do not reflect the extraordinary impact of COVID-19 on the shopping center industry.
